Large Dairy Herd Management Project (conference and e-book)

The ADSA Foundation's Large Dairy Herd Management (LDHM) project is under way. The project has two distinct, but very interrelated components—a conference and an e-book. The conference, "Large Dairy Herd Management" is scheduled for May 1 to 4, 2016, in Oak Brook, Illinois (Chicago area). Individuals serving on the conference planning committee also are section editors of the e-book. David Beede is the editor-in-chief, and Larry Miller (Discover Conferences) will organize the LDHM conference

Proposed sections of the conference and e-book are:

- Large herd systems of the world
- Building sustainability and capacity
- Milk markets and marketing
- Genetics, genomics and breeding
- Calves and replacements
- Reproduction and reproductive management
- Nutrition and nutritional management
- Location and milking systems
- Milk quality and mastitis
- Animal, herd welfare and animal behavior
- Herd health
- Physical facilities and environment
- Business and economic analysis and decision making
- Human resource management
- Precision management tools
- Future needs to 2030

Almost all section editors have now been confirmed; prospective authors will be confirmed and chapter titles finalized in late summer 2015. Chapter drafts will be due on March 1, 2016, and the May conference will include a working session with authors, reviewers, and editors to finalize e-book content.

The third edition of LDHM will be published in early 2017 as an e-book with a print-on-demand version. The book will be launched officially at the 2017 ADSA annual meeting in Pittsburgh. The new edition will include most of the sections of the second edition but have a somewhat broader, comprehensive scope and include some new sections. The target audience for the e-book includes progressive dairy farmers, professional dairy consultants, and upper-level university students.
